Bridges to the Baccalaureate can help!

Are you interested in Science and a lucrative, challenging career?

If you are a Capital student who has taken at least one semester of courses here for academic credit, you may be able to take advantage of the **Bridges to the Baccalaureate** program.

Bridges to the Baccalaureate is a program that puts minority students who enjoy Science on a path that leads to careers in healthcare, research or teaching. The Bridges program helps Capital Community College students transition to a 4-year program at the University of Connecticut.

Benefits include:

- Paid research experience during the academic year at UConn Health Center (\$5,500), and up to a \$2,000 stipend for summertime tutoring at UConn Storrs
- Getting on a solid career track with guidance from mentors in the field
- Opportunity to participate in national conference (\$500 towards the cost of attending)
- Tutoring & Counseling



Bridges student Stacha Campbell will graduate from Capital in June, and plans to attend UConn in the fall for her B.S. in Chemistry. "I am getting laboratory experience and learning all about work ethics," she says.
