COURSE TITLE: Medical Terminology

### CATALOG COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is intended for students interested in obtaining a knowledge and understanding of basic medical terminology as the language of the health care profession. The student learns basic medical word roots and combining forms, suffixes, prefixes, and abbreviations. Correct spelling, forming singulars and plurals, understanding definitions, and using the terms correctly are important components of the course. This course is especially useful for health professionals or students enrolling in EMT or Radiologic Technology and is a required course for Medical Assisting.
