Course Title: Intermediate French II

Course Catalog Description: A continuation of Intermediate French I. Further development of oral and writing proficiency.

Lecture Hours Per Week: 3 Credit Hours: 3

Prerequisite: French 201 or equivalent

Section II

Course Scope and Content: Intermediate French II is a language course designed for students who, having successfully completed Intermediate French I, wish to continue developing their language skills and enrich their cultural awareness of the French speaking world. Intermediate French II will cover lessons 40 through 52 in the required texts, videos, and audiocassettes.

Required Work: Will vary by instructor.

Attendance and Participation: Regular attendance and class participation are required.

Methods of Instruction: The methods of instruction are determined by each instructor and may include, but are not limited to, lecture, lecture/discussion, small group, collaborative learning, experimental/exploration, student presentations, use of technologies, such as audio-visual materials, computer, and language laboratory.
